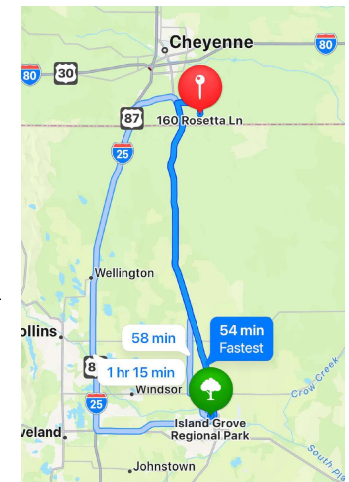
AND THE TRIAL FIELD:

There are three routes from the show site at Island Grove Regional Park to / from the lure coursing field. Driving time varies between 54 minutes and 1 hour 15 minutes, but traffic can dramatically change this.

For the (usually) fastest route from the show site, take D Avenue to N 8th Avenue (US-85 N) where you turn left / north. Follow this for a bit more than 40 miles, crossing into Wyoming. Turn right onto Chalk Bluff Road and follow this for 3 miles, then turn right onto Rosetta Lane. The field is 1.4 miles down, on your right.

Please consult real-time mapping software to determine which is route is most efficient at the time of your drive, especially when returning to the show site after the trial.

ROLL CALL & INSPECTION:

Test and Trial Hours 6:00 am until completion

Each entry will be examined at inspection for breed disqualifications. Bitches in season and lame hounds will be excused. **Dogs may not be wrapped in any way during inspection.** Entry fee for hounds excused, during inspection, for bitches in season, lameness or breed disqualification shall be refunded. Spayed or neutered hounds, without breed disqualifications, may be entered. **Roll call will follow immediately after the conclusion of inspection.** Hounds not present at the time of roll call will be scratched without refund of entry fees after a five (5) minute grace period.

JC and QC Test #1: Inspection ENDS at 6:45 am

Trial and JC Test #2: Inspection ENDS at 7:00 am or 10 minutes after the conclusion of JC/QC Test #1, whichever is later.

If you are entering a QC and want to enter the trial with the certifying dog, you must also include an entry form entering your dog in the SINGLES stake for the trial. Dogs that pass the QC can be moved to the Open stake if desired. QC dog entries must arrange for a certification bye dog for the QC run.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given for dogs withdrawn before closing. Refunds will be given for female dogs in season or any dogs who do not pass inspection

TESTS OFFERED

JUNIOR COURSER TEST: Open to all hounds of an eligible breed one year or older on the day of the test. (See AKC Lure Coursing Rules and Regulations for any disqualifications that may apply). A hound running alone shall receive a certification from a Judge on one date and a second certification from a different Judge at a later date, stating that the hound completed a 600 yard course with a minimum of (4) turns. The hound must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption.

QUALIFIED COURSER TEST: Open to a hound at least 12 months of age running with another hound of the same breed—or another breed with a similar running style. The hound must complete the course with enthusiasm and without interruption, sufficiently course the lure and not course the Testing Hound. The judge will certify that the Qualifying Hound ran cleanly and did not appear to present a hazard to the Testing Hound at any point in the qualifying course. This certificate is required to enter a hound in an Open Stake. **THE HANDLER PRESENTING THE QUALIFYING HOUND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING THE TESTING HOUND FOR THE QUALIFYING COURSE.** It is strongly recommended that every qualifying hound have been run previously in practice and that—to the handler's satisfaction—runs cleanly and keenly with other hounds.

STAKES OFFERED

Stakes will be split by public random draw if the entry in any one stake is sufficient to hold two or more five-point majors. In the Trial, all hounds will run twice unless excused, dismissed, or disqualified. After the stake winners are all decided, the winners of each stake will be run in trios if possible, or braces, if necessary for BOB.

OPEN: Open to all greyhounds that have obtained an AKC Qualified Courser certificate.

This requirement will be waived for hounds that have earned a Field Championship title from the American Sighthound Field Association (ASFA) or the Canadian Kennel Club (CKC). ASFA or CKC Field Champions must submit a copy of their title certificate to the host club when they enter their first AKC Open Stake. This copy must be included when the results of the trial are sent to AKC. Championship points earned from the Open Stake will only count toward a Field Champion title. Hounds that have earned an AKC Field Championship title are not eligible to enter the Open Stake.

VETERAN STAKE: Open to all greyhounds which are eligible to enter Open or Special Stakes and are 6 years of age. Points won from the Veteran Stake may count toward either a Field Championship title or Lure Courser Excellent title. Qualifying scores earned from the Veterans Stake will count toward a Senior Courser or Master Courser title.

SPECIALS STAKE: Open to all greyhounds that have earned their AKC Field Championship titles. Championship points earned from the Specials Stake will count toward Lure Courser Excellent titles. Qualifying scores earned from the Specials Stake will count toward a Senior Courser or Master Courser title.

SINGLES STAKES: Open to all greyhounds approved to participate in AKC Lure Coursing trials. Hounds with breed disqualifications are eligible to enter, as are hounds that have been disqualified by a judge for being aggressive to another dog while coursing. Singles Stakes winner not eligible for BOB.

RIBBONS

Best of Breed Purple and Gold Rosette.
Rosettes for First Place Blue, Second Place Red, Third Place Yellow, Fourth Place White, Fifth Place Pink.
Dark Green Qualifying Rosettes for hounds passing a Junior Courser or Qualified Courser Test.

Rosettes for High Scoring Veteran, High Scoring Dual Champion, High Scoring NGA Greyhound, and High Scoring Conformation Champion.

SINGLES STAKE: First place will receive a silver medallion and a 28"x48" FMS Crate Pad

High Scoring Dual Champion and High Scoring Show Champion will not be awarded to the same dog. High Score Dual Champion will be awarded first from all eligible entries in the Regular Stakes (Open, Specials, Veterans). The next highest scoring Champion or Dual Champion in any stake (including Singles) will be awarded "High Scoring Champion."

GENERAL

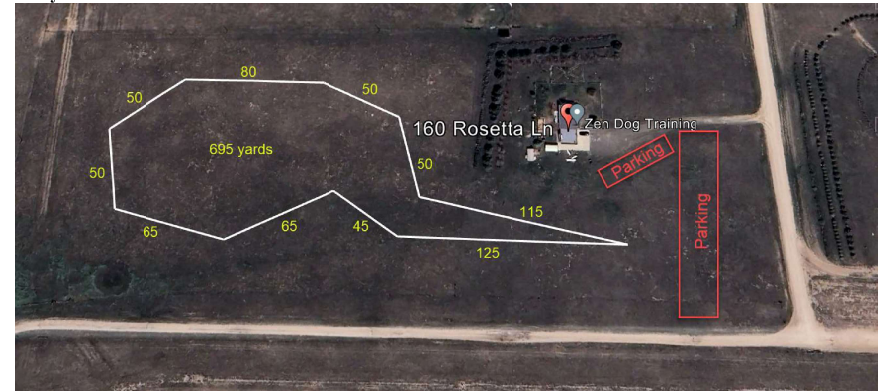
1. All entries must be one year of age or older on the day of the test or trial.
2. Entries in the regular stakes (Open, Specials, Veterans) will not be accepted for any hound that has received a DQ in either AKC LC or ASFA.
3. The field committee reserves the right to bar known aggressive hounds from the trial site.
4. Bring shade and water for your dogs and yourself. The weather in Wyoming is unpredictable, so dress in layers and bring a hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen.
5. Portable toilet will be available.
6. No fires allowed! If you must smoke, do so inside your vehicle.
7. There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose hound not taking part in the course in progress, or for anybody caught not picking up after their dog or leaving trash on the grounds.
8. **Anybody exhibiting unsportsmanlike behavior will be excused from the field and may be subject to further disciplinary action.**
9. All dogs must be on leash or confined in a crate, ex-pen, or vehicle at all times except when running. No flexi leads may be used on the grounds.
10. **Clean up and carry out all trash.** Pick up all dog feces and remove with trash or put in receptacle provided at site.

COURSE PLANS

GCA reserves the right to alter the course as required by weather, field conditions, or safety considerations on the day of the event. Course direction will be reversed in finals, and run-offs and Best of Breed direction is at the discretion of the judge. Gasoline and electric powered continuous lure machines, with back-up equipment, will be used in trials.

The field is natural pasture that is fenced on the north, west, and south sides. Parking will be along the driveway and in the field to present a barrier along the unfenced side.

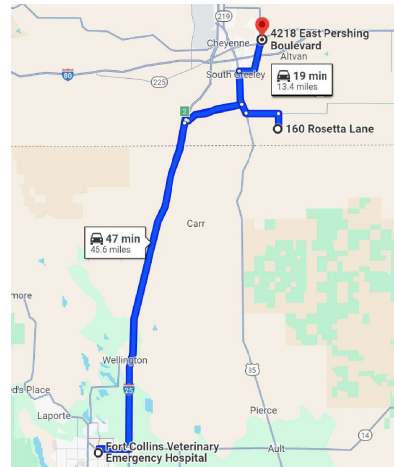

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
